WHAT TO PLANT IN MAY-JUNE-JULY

It's a great time of the year to garden!



SOW SEEDS DIRECT INTO THE GARDEN

- Carrots
- Beetroot
- Japanese turnips
- Lettuce
- Beans
- Zucchinni

With all the lovely rain we've had and the milder daytime temperatures

we have a wide variety of veg we can sow direct into the soil

JUST ABOUT ANYTHING COES!

Veg not suitable for planting right now-capsicum, eggplant, corn, melons

These are warm temperature vegetables and night time temps are too cool for them to do well







PLANTING POTATOES

- Start by clearing the soil
- Chook power is very efficient
- Lay potatoes on top of the soil
- Potatoes benefit from having direct contact with the soil for their roots
- Potatoes aren't affected by soil born disease this way
- New potatoes are easily grubbed out from under the decaying mulch

ADD MANURE, MULCH ETC

- Layer old manure on top of potatoes
- Add green mulch- chop and drop
- Add fresh manure
- Top with hay mulch















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PLANTING ONIONS AND GARLIC

- Small window of opportunity to grow garlic and onions- they need to be planted by late April
- Some people have good success with onions and garlic while others fail on the Sunshine Coast
- They like cooler nights
- They have a long growing season and in the dry of spring will need adequate irrigation
- Some garlic doesn't tend to bulb and only form one single clove/ bulb
- Onions tend to rot if the summer rains comes too early
- Grow spring onions and eschallots instead for easier productivity





PLANT BROCCOLI NO LATER THAN JULY

- The size of your broccoli will be determined by soil fertility
- Broccoli will keep giving small secondary heads until late November



PLANT CABBAGES NO LATER THAN JULY EXCEPT SUGARLOAF

 Cabbage is susceptable to insect damage
